

The Mosquito

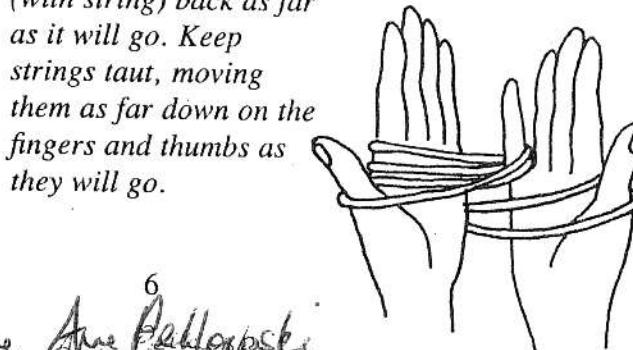
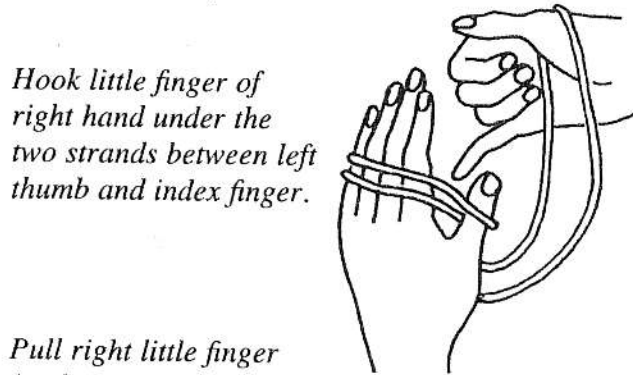
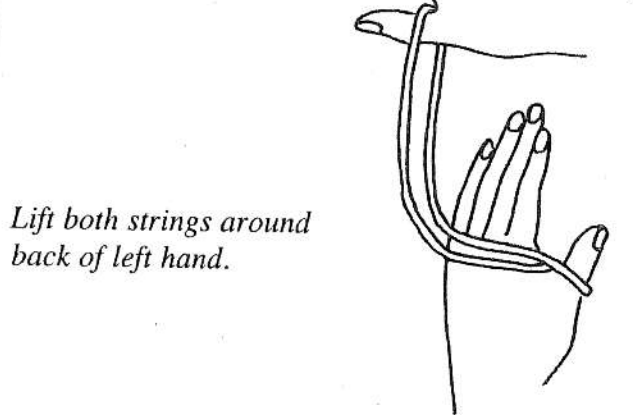
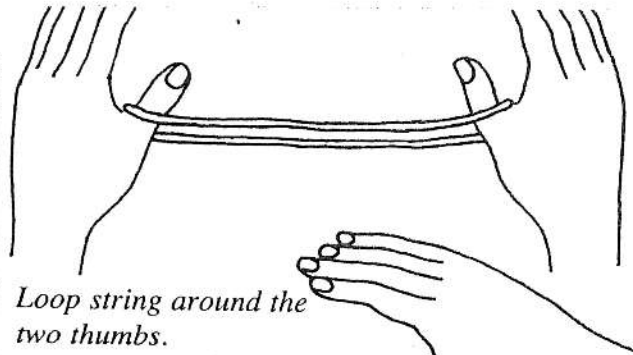
A woman sat weaving one day, when suddenly she heard a buzzing noise nearby.

Suddenly the buzzing grew very loud. The woman looked at her weaving and saw—

Bring left little finger toward right palm and from the top, curl it under the two strands running from right thumb across the palm.

Move the left little finger, with string, back into position, so the hands are side by side, palms facing you. There should be almost no space between the hands.

With the right thumb and index finger, pick up the two strands of string running from the left palm to the back of the left hand. Bring the two strings over all four fingers of the left hand and let go of them.

Quickly wiggle both hands back and forth, tightening the knot in the middle so that the figure ends up looking like a big mosquito. If necessary, use your right index finger to ease the knot to the center.
